Something Good Today

James 3 opens with echoes of Romans 3:23, "All have sinned." James 3:2 says, "All of us make many mistakes." Where James diverges from Romans is their focus. Romans 3:21-26 is about righteousness through faith. James 3:1-12 is about our words. The latter part of James 3:2 says, "Anyone who makes no mistakes in speaking is perfect, able to keep the whole body in check with a bridle."

When we think about how we live our faith, a great place to start is with our words. What we say matters. Reflecting Christ today begins with what we say. To me, James' acknowledgement that we make "many mistakes" is comforting, because no one is perfect. We might try to say the right thing but misspeak. Or, we might hope to say something kind and then realize that the other person thought we meant something else—something unkind. Instead of begrudging the other person, the opening of James 3:2 extends grace to such situations.

James 3 uses three analogies to better understand the impact of our words: horses, ships, and fire. First, it says, "If you put bits in the mouths of horses, you guide their whole bodies." Then, it turns to a maritime example, "Look at ships: though they are so large that it takes strong winds to drive them, yet they are guided by a very small rudder wherever the

will of the pilot directs." Finally, we read, "How great a forest is set ablaze by a small fire!" This last example has become too real in recent years with the proliferation of wildfires. They often start with something very small.

James says, "The tongue is small but has a great impact," and "The tongue is a fire." Instead of letting our words start a wildfire, we can use our words to encourage others, affirm the people we meet, extend gratitude, and say something positive. Greeting someone and smiling costs us nothing. If they ignore us, that's okay. If they respond, that's even better. When we see the effort that someone puts into doing something, we can tell them we appreciate it.

Each one of us can do something good today, and it can start with our words.


